- Length: 2 ³/₄ - 4 Pages (“Endnotes” and “Works Cited” pages not included)
 - Double Spaced
 - Times New Roman (12 point)
 - 1” Margins (left, right, top, bottom)

Style

- MLA Style (<http://www.aresearchguide.com/styleguides.html>)
- **Use Endnotes** (for citations, not footnotes or internal notes)
- Works Reviewed page
 - Can include items not cited, but examined during the process

Citation Issues

- Sources: A minimum of three (3) citations (each from a different source)
- One must be a print source (reference books are acceptable)
